

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The Table/Variety Saw





# Description:

The Table Saw is a tool that cuts large vertical cuts on small or wide pieces of wood at any angle O to 180°. It can be the greatest of all labour-saving machines, but is also the most dangerous if proper safety precautions are not observed.

# Operations:

After rip fence is adjusted you push your stock tight against fence towards the saw blade using a push stick when needed. You are either ripping (cutting with the grain lengthwise) or you are cross-cutting (cutting 90° against the grain).

# Things To Remember:

- + Keep wood you are cutting straight and tight to the fence.
- + Use a slow, steady, even feed rate into the work.
- + Use push stick to push wood through near or behind blade.

# Safety Contract for

### The Table Saw

- 1. Wear safety glasses!
- 2. Long hair must be enclosed in a hair net or be tied up.
- 3. Do not make free-hand cuts as the stock must be guided through either by the fence or the mitre gauge.
- 4. Maintain the rip fence parallel to the blade so the stock will not bind on the blade and be thrown.
- 5. Make sure that the blade has stopped turning before you adjust the table saw.
- 6. Do not reach behind or over the blade unless it has stopped turning.
- 7. The height of the blade should be set just slightly (max. 6 mm) higher than the stock.
- 8. Release work only when it has been pushed completely past the blade.
- 9. When the width of the rip is 6 inches or wider, use your right hand to feed the work piece.
- 10. When the width of the rip is 2 to 6 inches, use the push stick to feed the work.
- + Look at yourself, if you have all your body parts and your not bleeding, then you can appreciate the benefits of safety in the shop.
