SANDPAPER

- Sandpaper is a *misnomer*. (a bad name) There is **no** sand in sandpaper.
- 2 Each piece of sandpaper is made up of 3 layers: Abrasive Adhesive Backing
- The **abrasive** or *grit size* is written on the back of each sheet. The **lower** the number the **rougher** the grit.
- The **adhesive** is the glue that holds the grit to the paper. It is a *flexible rubber cement.*
- **5** The **backing** can be *paper*, *cardboard*, *or cloth*.
- A sheet of sandpaper is the *same size* as a sheet of note paper. It **must** be *folded and ripped* into **4 pieces.**
- Sanding a wooden project must be done *in sequence*. Start sanding with the lowest grit and move through the grits until the project is **smooth** and **free from scratches**. This is called **Progressive sanding**.
 - **Do not skip a grit** as *this will leave scratches* in the surface.
- **3** Sanding **does not change the shape** of a project, it will **only** *smooth out the surface.*
